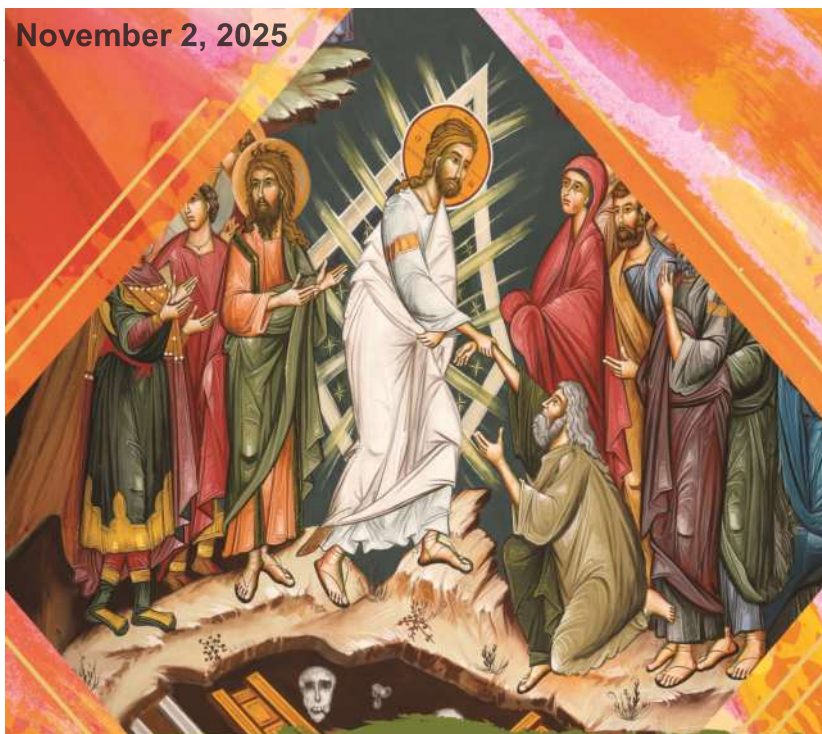

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

John 6:37-40

I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn't find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today's Gospel (John 6:37-40), he says, **“This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me.”** Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the Father has given him. He searches for every lost soul — as the shepherd leaves the ninety-nine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin — and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost.

On All Souls' Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in his loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. Of what the Father gives him, he loses nothing.

Faithful Departed

Question:

How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?

Answer:

We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2nd each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the ante-chamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. We can also remember the departed in our daily prayers. Just as we have special intentions for family and friends here on earth, we can pray for those who have died. It's also a good act of Christian charity to pray for the forgotten, those who have no one else to pray for them. God knows who they are!

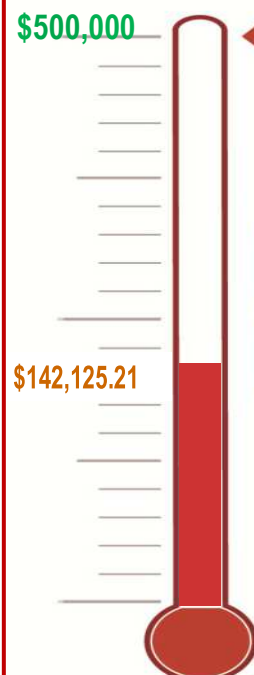

¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? -
VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Resurrección de los Muertos

Pregunta:

¿Qué creen los católicos sobre la resurrección de los muertos?

Respuesta:

Todos los domingos, proclamamos en el Credo que creemos "en la resurrección de la carne". ¿Significa eso la resurrección de Cristo o la nuestra? ¡Ambos! La resurrección de Jesús es parte de la obra de salvación, pero también es una señal de lo que está por venir. Si bien la muerte separa nuestros cuerpos y nuestras almas, esta no era la intención de Dios cuando nos creó por primera vez. Es un efecto del pecado original. Al final de los tiempos, nuestros cuerpos y nuestras almas se reunirán.

Científicamente, podemos tener preguntas sobre esto, ya que los cuerpos se descomponen a lo largo de los siglos. ¿O qué hay de los santos, cuyas reliquias están esparcidas por toda la tierra? Cómo sucederá la resurrección es un misterio. Pero sabemos que nuestro cuerpo resucitado será *nuestro* cuerpo. Si estamos en el cielo, nuestro cuerpo estará en un estado glorificado. Algunos teólogos especulan cómo será esta glorificación basándose en el cuerpo resucitado de Jesús. ¿Seremos capaces de caminar a través de las paredes? ¿Comeremos, ya que Jesús partió el pan con sus discípulos? Realmente no sabemos las respuestas a estas preguntas. Sí sabemos, sin embargo, que estaremos libres de los efectos de la caída (como la enfermedad y el dolor) y de los defectos físicos que ocurrieron en la vida. ¡Cristo nos redime como personas completas, en cuerpo y alma!

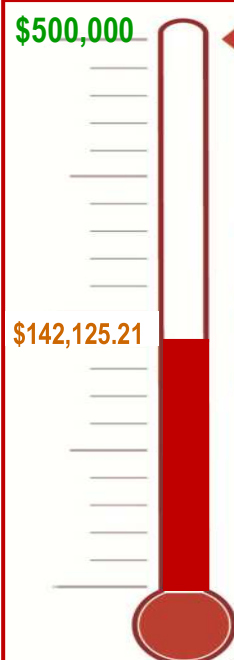

Prayer for the Dead, Explained!

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ.

Prayer for the dead is a practice which not only predates Catholicism but predates Jesus Christ, as we see in the Second Book of Maccabees (2 Maccabees 12:42-45).

"By virtue of the 'communion of saints,' the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055).

The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: "Eternal rest grant unto them, o Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace." ©LPi

Resurrection of the Dead

Question:

What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

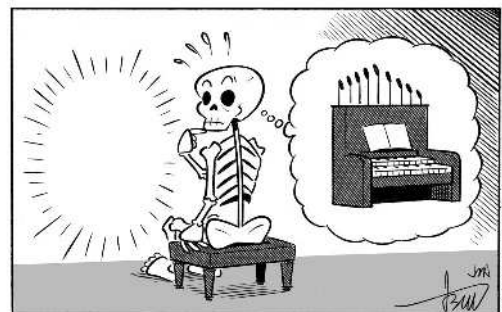
Answer:

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be *our* body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!
