

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Matthew 4:12-23

I was 22 years old, lying in bed one night while on a pilgrimage, when I suddenly sensed an idea in my mind: "Go to the seminary." There was no voice, no vision, but a gentle and unmistakable clarity. I simply prayed, "Lord, if that's from you, let me find great joy in it." Three days later, my heart was bursting with joy. I dropped everything and entered the seminary. The older I get, the stranger my rather careless and hasty departure seems to me. I followed not because it made sense, or because I was especially brave. I went because the Lord called me.

Something like this happens in today's Gospel. Jesus walks by Simon, Andrew, James, and John and says, "**Come after me**" (Matthew 4:19). And *immediately* they leave their nets and follow. There's no explanation, no hesitation ... just movement. Why? As St. John says, "**In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us**" (1 John 4:10). They do not leave their nets because his call made perfect, calculable sense. They left them because they were called. And Jesus' call is powerful.

Take a moment this week to remember when Christ first called you. However small or quiet it was, recall it, and give thanks. The more we marvel that Christ has called us personally, the more passionately and freely we will follow him.



Gospel Meditations

Matthew 4:12-23

In Jesus, all of God's promises are fulfilled. The words of Isaiah in the first reading tell us this: *"The people who lived in darkness have seen a great light."* Joy multiplied and gladness increased. The reason for the people's joy is simple: the yoke that oppressed them was broken. Experiencing freedom is wonderful, and it can be enjoyed in many ways: from illness to healing; from imprisonment to freedom; from unhealthy relationships to breaking free. In short, there are many examples. But there is one we should follow very closely: *"Those who lived in darkness have seen a great light, a light that has dawned on those who lived in the land of the shadow of death"* (Matthew 4:16).

In our lives, what are the places of shadow and death? Where should the light enter to illuminate our existence? Conversion of heart must be the guide that steers the course of our lives. Saint Paul points us in one of many directions: that there be no divisions among us, but rather, that there be harmony among families and the community. He clearly reminds us that we belong to Christ. The key lies in knowing how to live according to the Gospel. Pope Leo XIV offers us sure guidelines for reaching Christ: *"Help one another to build bridges through dialogue, through encounter, uniting all of us to be one people, always at peace."* *"Humanity needs Him as a bridge to be reached by God, by His love."* ©LPI

ANUNCIOS DE LA COMMUNIDAD PARROQUIAL

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO – ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

Mateo 4:12-23

En Jesús se cumplen todas las promesas de Dios. Las palabras de Isaías en la primera lectura nos lo dicen: "El pueblo que habitaba en las tinieblas vio surgir una luz brillante". El gozo se multiplicó y la alegría aumentó. La razón de la alegría del pueblo es sencilla: se rompió el yugo que los oprimía. Experimentar la libertad es algo maravilloso, y se puede gozar de muchas formas: desde una enfermedad, a quedar sano; de estar encarcelado, y ser puesto en libertad; de relaciones no buenas, a romper con ellas. En fin, existen muchos ejemplos. Pero hay uno que debemos seguir muy de cerca: "La gente que vivía en la oscuridad ha visto una luz muy grande; una luz que ha brillado para los que viven en lugares de sombras de muerte" (Mateo 4:16).

¿En nuestra vida, cuáles son los lugares de sombra y de muerte? ¿Dónde debe entrar la luz que ilumine nuestra existencia? La conversión del corazón debe ser la guía que oriente el timón de nuestra vida. San Pablo nos indica una de tantas direcciones: que no haya divisiones entre nosotros, sino, por el contrario, que exista concordia entre las familias y la comunidad. Claramente nos recuerda que pertenecemos a Cristo. La clave está en saber vivir de acuerdo con el Evangelio. El Papa León XIV nos ofrece pautas seguras para llegar a Cristo: "Ayúdense los unos a los otros a construir puentes con el diálogo, con el encuentro, uniéndonos todos para ser un solo pueblo, siempre en paz". "La humanidad necesita de Él como puente para ser alcanzada por Dios, por su amor".

Paciencia


Paciencia, ¡Explicada!

Al tratar a los demás con un espíritu de paciencia, [dijo el Papa Francisco](#), "los miramos... con la mirada de Dios, sabiendo distinguir sus rostros de sus faltas".

"La prisa y la impaciencia son enemigas de la vida espiritual", continuó. "Dios es amor, y los que aman no se cansan, no son irascibles; no dan ultimátum. Dios es paciente, Dios sabe esperar".

A veces se hace referencia a la paciencia como "anexada" a la virtud moral de la fortaleza. Al practicar la paciencia, sopor-tamos cualquier tipo de sufrimiento por un bien mayor. Santo Tomás de Aquino describe la paciencia como un medio para "salvaguardar el bien de la razón contra el dolor, para que la razón no ceda al dolor" (*Sum. II-II*, 136, art. 1).

La virtud de la paciencia es un fruto del Espíritu Santo (Gálatas 5:22), y como cristianos que hemos recibido el Espíritu Santo estamos llamados a "ser pacientes en la tribulación" (Romanos 12:12) y a "predicar el mensaje (de Cristo) ... con gran paciencia" (2 Timoteo 4:2). ©LPi

ORDINARY MOMENTS**

Sea of Galilee Moments

Young or old, believer or non-believer, rich or poor, healthy or sick: it doesn't matter who we are. It doesn't matter what our life looks like. If we are a human being, if we have a soul, we stand on the shore of a great and powerful sea, a net in our hands and a hunger in our soul.

So what's in the sea? I don't know about yours, but mine is filled with feelings of inadequacy. It's filled with fear and resentment and confusion. It's filled with misplaced pride. It's deep. It's dark. It's well-stocked.

I cast my net, over and over again. What else is there to do? If I draw back a harvest, it can sustain me for days, weeks, maybe even years. The nourishment of the sea can keep away the hunger pangs — for a time. You can survive on fear and resentment and pride if it's all you have. You'll never feel full, and you'll never be strong, but you'll survive on what the world can offer you — so long as you keep coming back to the shore.

This is where Jesus finds us.

If I close my eyes, I can picture the moments exactly, all of them: my Sea of Galilee moments. I could describe them to you — the day, the year, what was happening in my life, what I wanted and what I needed and what gnawing hunger had brought me, once again, limping, crawling back to the shore.



But you wouldn't understand my Sea of Galilee moments, just like I wouldn't understand yours. There is only one who understands, and his is the voice we heard, clear and strong: "Put down the net, and come with me." ©LPi




Clothing Donations for the Homeless
