GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Matthew 14:22-33

I don't know if you've ever been afraid of something or someone in your life, and realized that fear paralyzes you: it doesn't let you move forward, it even blinds you and prevents you from seeing. Often, the causes of fear are false and only serve to intimidate the person and leave them without hope. Fear also robs us of peace and prevents us from making plans for the future. Pope Leo XIV stated that: *"The more beautiful the plan, the greater the hope,"* knowing that *"the future is in the hands of Him who offers the greatest hope."* Saint Cardinal John Henry Newman, canonized by Pope Francis in October 2019, wrote the following: *"Through the darkness that surrounds me, lead me ever onward. The night is dark, and I am far from home: lead me ever onward. Guide my steps; one step at a time is enough for me. I wished to choose and see my way, but now lead me ever onward."*

The Gospel passage that tells us what happened to the disciples on the mar that night is very similar to what we experience in our daily lives. The boat was being battered by the waves, and the wind was strong. In the midst of all this, Jesus appeared, walking on the water, and they, frightened, thought they saw a ghost. Fear paralyzed them, and they cried out in terror. Immediately, Jesus said to them, *"Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid"* (Matthew 14:27). Lord, we lack faith like Peter! Give us your hand and save us.

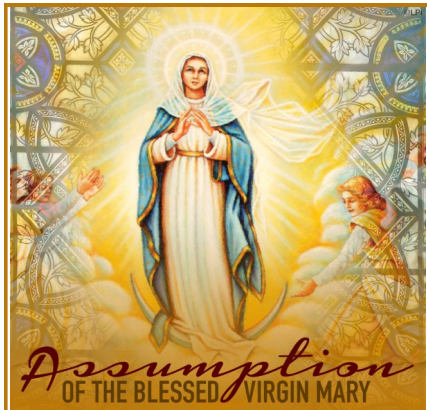

Looking for God

What do we think when we see Jesus coming to save us?

The first thing the Apostles scream is "Ghost!" when they catch sight of Jesus walking towards them on water. That always makes me laugh. After all they have witnessed thus far as the companions of the Messiah, they see someone walking on water and they still react like extras in a bad episode of Scooby-Doo.

We are always more quick to believe a bad thing than a good thing. We can easily believe gossip and hearsay about a friend, but we fear being taken for a fool when it comes to faith. We would rather look cynical than stupid.

"Save me, God, for the waters have reached my neck," reads Psalm 69. "My eyes fail, from looking for my God."

I think back on my life, on all the various ways that God has rescued me from slipping beneath the surface. Rarely did it ever occur to me, in the midst of it, that I was being rescued. In fact, I usually thought I was being held underwater. Did I hear His voice directing me, or did I only hear my own despairing? "Save me, God." Was I looking for Him, or were my eyes shut in fear? "My eyes fail, from looking for my God."

It's never until after the fact — sometimes years after, or decades — that we see things clearly. That we see Christ in the situation, making his way toward us, hand outstretched.

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Reflection

The Assumption: A Sign of Hope

Is the resurrection a concept or reality? For many of us, the resurrection of the dead may be a stray idea recite in the Nicene Creed. Heaven we discuss. But resurrection? The feast of the Assumption is a reminder to us that heaven gets even better! We pray that the souls of the faithful departed would soon be united to God in heaven. The truth is, the separation between our souls and our bodies was not God's original plan for things. It's one of the results of the Fall, of original sin. At the end of time and Jesus' second coming, our bodies and souls will be reunited. Lest we forget, Mary's Assumption is the reminder. Today, we celebrate that Mary is enjoying what we, too, hope to participate in — complete joy in heaven with our God, experienced body and soul. Today and every day, let's pray for those who have died and that we may meet them again in the heavenly kingdom.

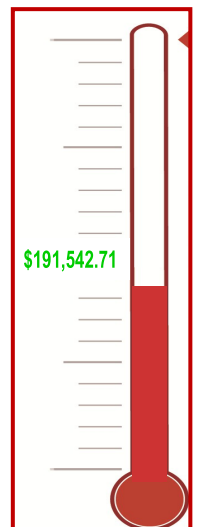

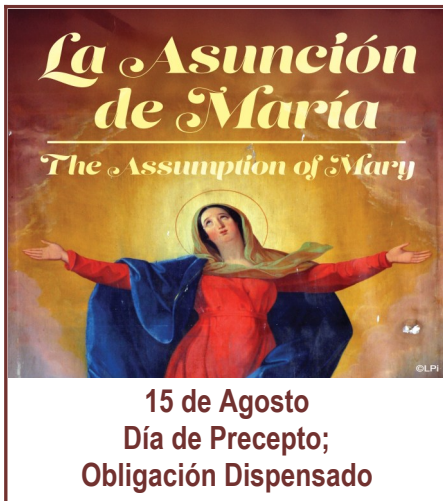

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¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Jesús es la Luz del Mundo

Pregunta:

¿Por qué llamamos a Jesús "la luz del mundo"?

Respuesta:

En culturas de todo el mundo, la luz y la oscuridad son símbolos principales del bien y el mal, orden y caos, claridad y confusión, esperanza y desesperación. Estos símbolos conectan con algo esencial sobre la naturaleza de las cosas. Dios nos ha dado el mundo creado como un regalo. Su primer trabajo, como vemos en Génesis 1, es crear *luz*, dando significado y visión al abismo. Es en la luz donde surge el resto de la creación. Una oscuridad creciente emerge en Génesis 3. Adán y Eva se esconden, protegiéndose de los rayos del sol y de la mirada de Dios. Aunque Dios ofrece una promesa de salvación y establece un pacto con su pueblo, la sensación de niebla y de entendimiento tenue siguen ahí. El pueblo hebreo traiciona repetidamente las promesas que ha hecho a Dios, y a su alrededor las naciones adoran activamente a los ídolos.

Sin embargo, la promesa de Dios no es en vano. En Juan 1, vemos una representación de Cristo como bondad primordial, orden, claridad y esperanza. *"La verdadera luz, que ilumina a todos venía al mundo ... esta vida fue la luz de la raza humana"* (Juan 1:9, 4). Piensa en el último amanecer que presenciaste (¿si pudiste despertarte para ello!). Mientras veías cómo la lavanda se iluminaba hasta convertirse en un borde dorado, ¿se te hinchó el corazón? ¿Recordabas la bondad del mundo? ¿Sentiste una esperanza renovada? Tal es el papel de Cristo en el alma. Así es su llegada encarnada en nuestro mundo.

DIÓCESIS DE SAN DIEGO



Se les pide a los fieles de la Diócesis de San Diego que actúen con precaución ante un grupo de hombres que se hacen pasar fraudulentamente por sacerdotes y un obispo católico. Afirman ser Misioneros Guadalupanos del Santísimo Sacramento (MGSS) y están ofreciendo sacramentos a familias católicas a cambio de dinero. Se informa al público que cualquier sacramento conferido por estos hombres es inválido e ilícito. Este grupo de hombres-algunos de ellos sacerdotes ordenados, pero ahora reducidos al estado laical-han formado se propia secta; residen en Rosarito, pero no están en comunión con la fe de la Iglesia católica romana. Se han recibido informes sobre la presencia de estos sacerdotes fraudulentos en nuestra diócesis; por ello, se les pide a los fieles contactar a su párroco en caso de tener conocimiento de cualquier incidente. Algunos nombres de los sacerdotes fraudulentos son: Obispo Lauro, Octavio Aguilar Oliveros, Gabriel Figueroa y Raymundo Figueroa Pérez.

Si alguna persona ha sido víctima de fraude en relación con estos sacerdotes, por favor, contacte a las autoridades.

DIOCESE OF SAN DIEGO



The Faithful of the Diocese of San Diego are asked to exercise caution with a group of men fraudulently posing as Catholic priests and bishops. They claim to be Guadalupan Missionaries of the Most Holy Sacraments (MGSS) and are offering sacraments to Catholic families in exchange for money. The public is advised that any sacraments conferred by these men are invalid and illicit. These groups of men, some of them ordained priests but now laicized, have formed their own sect and reside in Rosarito but not in communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Reports of these fraudulent priests have been sighted in our diocese and the public must contact their priests should you become aware of any incidents. Some of the fraudulent priests names are: Bishop Larro, Octavio Aguilar Oliveros, Gabriel Figueroa, Raymundo Figueroa Pérez.

If anyone is a victim of fraud relating to these priests, please contact the authorities.

Reporting Allegations of Sexual Misconduct

The diocese of San Diego treats all allegations of sexual misconduct by clergy or Church personnel seriously and deals with them in a prompt, confidential and thorough manner. DIÓCESIS DE SAN DIEGO



Tal como fue anunciado previamente por la Diócesis en 2022, al Concluir una visita canónica de tres años, la Sede Apostólica *específicamente la entonces Congregación para los Institutos de Vida Consagrada y las Sociedades de Vida Apostólica*, mediante un Decreto fechado el 13 de mayo de 2022 y aprobado en forma específica por el Papa Francisco, uprimió el instituto religioso anteriormente conocido como las Trinitarias de María.

Con esta supresión, las antiguas miembros de las Trinitarias quedaron automáticamente dispensadas de sus votos y ya no están autorizadas a presentarse como religiosas. No existe derecho de apelación, y las Trinitarias han dejado de existir como instituto religioso reconocido por la Iglesia Católica.

DIOCESE OF SAN DIEGO



As previously announced by the Diocese in 2022, at the conclusion of a three-year visitation, the Apostolic See (*specifically the then-Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life*) by means of a Decree dated 13 May 2022 and approved in forma specifica by Pope Francis, suppressed the religious institute formerly known as the Trinitarians of Mary. With this suppression, the former members of the Trinitarians were automatically dispensed from their vows and are no longer permitted to present themselves as religious. There is no right of appeal, and the Trinitarians have ceased to exist as a religious institute recognized by the Catholic Church.



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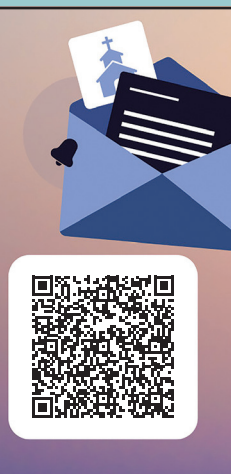
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
